KSI Trip to the Botanical Gardens

On Monday 18 June our Key Stage I pupils had a fantastic day out at The Botanical Gardens in Cambridge.

Whilst at the Gardens they had the opportunity to use all of their senses along with practising their measuring skills. There were four activities spread throughout the day. Some activities involved observing plants in a range of climates whilst others involved smelling herbs and flowers in the scented areas. We all enjoyed the tree hunt and measuring the trees using a range of units of measure.

The behaviour of the children was praised by staff at the gardens and the coach drivers.

Yr I Healthy Eating Workshop

Last week the Year I children attended a Healthy Eating Workshop at school.

Each class took part in three activities. In the first activity the children had to guess how many teaspoons of sugar there were in different types of foods. All of the children, including the staff, were amazed at how much sugar is in our food! A child should have a total of 6 teaspoons of sugar throughout the day and when we calculated the different foods that the children might consume on an average day it totaled 43 teaspoons!

In the second activity the children were given cards of different foods and they had to place them on the different food groups. The children were quite good at this and asked some good questions to clarify any misunderstandings in their learning.

The final activity was an active one where the children were running around and when the leaders called out a healthy fruit or vegetable the children had to make the shape of that food.

The workshops were run by Everybody Health who also encourage school communities to follow the Change+Life activities. All of the children had an enjoyable and informative time.

Sun Cream

With the arrival of the warmer weather we would like to take this opportunity to remind parents that we encourage the children to come into school each day with their sun hats (named) and a water bottle.

Sun protection cream should be applied before school. Children are able to bring their own bottle of sun protection cream into school (ensuring that the bottle is clearly named) and this can be re-applied by the child at lunchtime. It's helpful if you can show your child how to apply the sun cream as some of our children are very heavy handed and end up applying nearly a whole bottle in one application.

Please do remind your child that they should not be sharing their sun cream with other children.

Free School Meals

Following a recent consultation by the DfE there will be a new income threshold for all families receiving or going onto Universal Credits (UC)

From I April 2018 the new Income Threshold has changed to £7,400 net pay per annum (take home pay). This means that more families may be eligible to claim for this financial help.

In addition to the families receiving the financial help schools will also receive financial help for every successful claim until the child moves on to secondary school.
