Children Centre Consultation process

A consultation to redesign Children's Centre Services has gone live, which aims to ensure every child thrives in Cambridgeshire.

The proposals will also see Children's Centres work more closely with parents and health professionals to provide a set of integrated services that seamlessly support communities. This service could include health visitors, midwifery and speech therapists. The new approach includes:

 10 Child and Family Centres, delivered across 15 buildings, that will continue to offer services in places of high need with extended opening hours, with skilled staff able to meet family's needs

- 12 Child and Family Zones these will use community spaces, such as libraries and community centres, to deliver a range of services, including baby and toddler groups, activities for families with disabilities and places for community groups to meet. - Outreach Programme The Child and Family Centres workforce will deliver support across a range of community venues so families, particularly in rural locations, can access a regular programme of services and responsive support.
 - Online Offer there will be a comprehensive online offer to provide information and advice to help and support families

The Consultation was approved by the Children and Young People Committee on Thursday 13 July. The consultation ends on 22 September. Decisions relating to the final proposals for Children's Centre Services will be taken by the Children and Young People

Committee when it meets in the autumn.

This will impact on how services are run from the Children's Centre on our school site so please do take the time to complete the consultation.

Car Parking

Parents using The Brooklands car park are requested to park using the designated parking bays and not to block the access road to and from the car park. Care should also be taken to ensure that vehicles do not block the wheelchair access points for the pavements. If there are no spaces readily available close to the school parents are reminded that there is an overflow car park behind The Brooklands Centre.

When parking in Bellairs parents are requested to be considerate to all the residents and not block the access points to the houses.

We are very lucky to be able to have use of the community car parking facilities at the start and end of the school day. Please ensure that our school community does so in a manner that does not impact on our immediate neighbours in a negative way.

Jeans for Genes Day — Friday 22 September 2016

Each year in Britain 30,000 babies are born with genetic illnesses. This is the equivalent of one child in every classroom. The charity Jeans for Genes offers support to families and funds research into these illnesses.

On Friday 22 September we will be supporting this charity by allowing our children to pay £1.00 and come to school dressed in their jeans or denim skirt etc. On their top half the children should wear their normal school uniform.

If your child doesn't wear jeans they can support the charity by coming to school in a pair of trousers or skirt of their choice.
