We have been overwhelmed with the positive responses regarding our approaches to remote learning and how we are supporting our school based learners, during this lockdown period. It is truly inspirational to see just how adaptable our staff, children and families have been in making this transition. We are seeing how our preparations for this are paying off. Well done to everyone for managing to log on and to get the technology working, it has been lovely for children to still connect with each other and their teaching staff, helping us all to feel a little less isolated.

We understand that for some families at home that technology can be a barrier. Following our questionnaire in the Autumn term, we have generated a list of families who will receive devices via the DFE service and are awaiting delivery. Naturally, we will prioritise those with no device first, followed by those who have multiple children and insufficient devices. Please also see the dojo that was sent out on the school story last week regarding how to use a Playstation or Xbox to access Google Classroom.

From this week, teachers will be posting an optional collective worship for families to use on Google Classroom. These are known as 'Picture News' so please do look out for them. As you will hopefully understand, we are learning more and more about the functionality of Google Classroom and over the next few weeks, we hope to gradually refine our practice, as we are sure you will too. The section at the end of this newsletter should help to clarify some frequently asked questions and we will be adding a regular slot to help you with these.

Please don't forget that you can also visit our 'Maths Zone' on the school website to look at archived videos for teaching maths strategies and methods at home with the children.

A Parent Guide to Google Classroom

We are using Google Classroom for all children for our home learning offer. Google Classroom is a space where children can access their learning online. It is available through a laptop or Chromebook as well as a downloadable app on most tablets and smartphones. Below are instructions for how to log on and access work for your child.

Username and passwords

Each child has a unique username and password to log on. Their username is linked to their name then@suttoncofe.co.uk. If you need help with this, please contact the school office.


Google Classroom

If accessing through a **Desktop PC, Mac or laptop**, this can be done by clicking on this link https://classroom.google.com or typing it into the search bar on your browser.

If you are using a **Chromebook**, you will need to download the Google Classroom app from the Web Store. Once done, ask your child to sign in using their school login as below. If you are unable to do this, it may be that you will need to login to the Chromebook using your child's username and password instead from the startup screen.

If you are using an iPad or other tablet or smartphone, please download the free Google Classroom app from the App Store.

To sign in



Your child should enter their username as detailed above. This needs to be the full username including the @suttoncofe.co.uk. Click next.

Now, enter their password and click 'Next' Click on the title to enter the Classroom (the first time they log in. They may need to click 'accept' to join the class).

You will see the following options as tabs across the top of the page:

Stream

This is where your child will see posts from their teachers. Posts may contain links to websites, classwork set by your child's teacher or simple communications between all the members of the class. Posts are always monitored by your child's teacher, as are any accompanying comments made by individuals, so we ask that children only use this feature if they are asking a question about their work or responding sensibly to a post.

Classwork

This is where your child will access curriculum content set by the teacher. **This is the best way of accessing the content** set rather than having to worry about searching on the Stream.

Any curriculum content added will be in the form of a Google Doc, Google Slide or other Google Suite app (If you are using a tablet, you may be required to download additional free apps) as this will allow the children to edit and hand in their work individually to the teacher. Classwork will be added regularly and may have a due date for completion. Teachers will be able to see your child's progress and support them where necessary and can add comments to the children's work.

Under the Classwork tab you will see dates for the week covering the home learning for a period of 5 days. Under this you will see work for each day. On a daily, or weekly basis, these will be populated with work for your child. Routines are important to children and we will post a suggested timetable for each week on the website and in the Google Classroom. You don't have to stick to this rigidly and we understand of course that managing working from home and supporting children with home learning is a difficult juggling act, but we think this is a useful guide to help you and your child manage their time.

If your child is stuck with a piece of work, they can post a comment using the private message function at the right hand side of the screen to message the teacher.

Please note that teachers are working in school with groups of children during the week so won't be able to respond to messages every day. Year group teams will work together and may share work across more than one classroom.
