
YEAR 1 PUPILS INVESTIGATE HOW TO MAKE THE PERFECT SANDCASTLE

School Fruit and Vegetable Scheme

Free, daily fruit and vegetable provision for Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 has resumed this term. Pupils from these respective groups can bring in their own snack, as can pupils across Key Stage 2, but these must be either a piece of fruit, a vegetable or a healthy dairy product (e.g. cheese, yoghurt etc.). In keeping with the Government's Healthy Schools initiative, all pupils are to adhere to this.

Don't forget all Reception, Year 1 & Year 2 pupils are eligible for free school meals irrespective of family income.
