Term Dates for the New Academic Year (2018-2019)

FS and KSI Sports Days

On Wednesday 4 July we will be hosting the FS Sports Day at 9:15am.

This will be followed by the KSI Sports Day at approximately 10:30am

Parents may start arriving from 8:45am; the children will be complete their morning registration and then come out for a warm activity before the event starts. The gates will reopen for the KSI event at 10:15am but parents who will be attending both events are welcome to stay for the start of the KSI event.

Photographs may be taken at the event; parents wishing to take photos will be asked to sign a form on entry to the school grounds. Parents and members of our school community are asked to abide by our strict Photographic Policy and to not post photographs from the event on any form of social media.

On the day we would like the children in the FS and KSI to come to school dressed in their PE Kits. They should have their school uniform with them so that they can change once their event is over.

Our Yr 5 pupils will be helping at the event and they too should come to school dressed in their PE kits with their school uniform in a bag to change into after both events have finished.

Sunny Weather

With the warmer weather set to continue possibly until the end of term parents are reminded that we encourage the children to come into school each day with their sun hats (named) and a water bottle.

Sun protection cream should be applied before school. Children are able to bring their own bottle of sun protection cream into school (ensuring that the bottle is clearly named) and this can be re-applied by the child at lunchtime. It's helpful if you can show your child how to apply the sun cream as some of our children are very heavy handed and end up applying nearly a whole bottle in one application.

Please do remind your child that they should not be sharing their sun cream with other children.

School Budget

Despite increasing costs, over the past couple of years our school has seen a reduction in the amount of money we receive for our annual school budget. The biggest reduction has come from the re-calculation of the IDACI Index (Income Deprivation Affecting Children Income). This money is calculated using the postcodes within an individual school's catchment area; in the financial year 2016–2017 we received £100,000 from this income but from the current year going forwards this amount is only £1,000 per year.

In addition, with central government restricting the amount of funds that it gives to Local Authorities, the demands on our school budgets are continually being squeezed as the school is now required to pay for resources and outside professional help where previously we received these without charge from the Local Authority.

These financial pressures, along with a slightly declining school roll, have required the Governing Body and the school's Senior Leadership Team to take some difficult decisions including a restructuring of our staffing levels.

From September 2018 we will be operating with II classes, ceasing the Reading Recovery Programme that we currently run and will also be saying goodbye to a number of our support staff at the school.

In spite of these challenges and changes, which we appreciate may initially seem a cause for concern, the Governing Body and I are confident

that the children will continue to receive the necessary support that will allow them to continue to thrive in their learning and development.

KS2 Sports Day

A beautiful morning last Friday saw a large crowd of expectant parents gather for the Key Stage 2 Sports
Day. Joined by the Key Stage I and Foundation children, they were treated to an exciting and competitive display of sporting skill and determination.
Competing in both track and field events allowed the Key Stage 2 children to show a great variety of skills, and there were some outstanding performances.

The overall winners of the day were the Red team, but scores were very close — only 4 points separated the Red Team and the runners up!

Free School Meals

Following a recent consultation by the DfE there will be a new income threshold for all families receiving or going onto Universal Credits (UC)

From I April 2018 the new Income Threshold has changed to £7,400 net pay per annum (take home pay). This means that more families may be eligible to claim for this financial help.

In addition to the families receiving the financial help schools will also receive financial help for every successful claim until the child moves on to secondary school.
