Lunchtimes:

Thank you to those parents who have got in touch about the lunchtime trial. It is now into its third week and we are continually listening to feedback to ensure that lunchtimes evolve to be the most enjoyable experience for all.

From this feedback, we are looking to introduce the following:

Free flow day – Each house will have a day where they can choose to join any of their friends in any house / area providing they are respectful. This will initially be one day a week but it is hoped that we will be able to introduce this on other days too.

Year 5/6 Chill-Out Zone – this is an area where the Year 5/6 children are able to go and talk amongst their friends rather than join in with their house's activity on that day.

We are able to offer a new range of lunchtime to coincide with Year 6 finishing their SATs. The children have been looking forward to starting these and they will be getting under way next week.

A questionnaire will be going out to parents, staff and children next week to enable us gain a real perspective on what has been successful and what still needs to be worked on.

On this note we are arranging for a Local Authority advisor who has lots of experience in developing this kind of lunchtime arrangement to come in to give us further advice.

Next week (week beginning 20 May) we are running open lunch sessions to enable you to come and have lunch with your child, but also see the new lunchtime structure in action.

If you would like to come along to one of these sessions, please sign up at the office to enable you to order your lunch. Our open lunch sessions were very popular last time so please sign up promptly to avoid disappointment.

Safeguarding:

Please can we remind you that if you are entering the school building through the main entrance, can you not let others in as you leave. This is not due to the fact that we are wishing to be impolite but it is vital that all visitors are admitted and greeted by staff only as per safeguarding guidance.

Regarding visitors to the school, it is to be reminded that any visits to classes should not be occurring unless they have been agreed, arranged initially and then subsequently escorted to the class. Please do not be offended by these measures; they are put in place to ensure that the children's safety is first and foremost in our thoughts.

During the Summer holidays, there will be various works going on one of which will be a new security system on the front door. This will allow the whole process of visiting the school smoother and most importantly safer for the children.

These measures are standard safeguarding procedure in the most recent Keeping Children Safe in Education (KCSIE) document.

Class Structure:

As a staff (governors included) we have been working hard over the last few weeks to ensure that the class structure we adopt next year is the best possible for all parties but is also sustainable in the long term. With our average intake of children being 45, it is necessary from a financial point of view to run mixed year classes and therefore looking at the numbers we have come up with three different class structures that we believe could work in our school. These structures are attached with the newsletter and we would welcome your thoughts on the matter at the Parent Forum on Thursday 23 May from 2:45pm. If you cannot make the Parent Forum but would like to share your thoughts, please contact the school via the usual methods.

Post box:

You may not have noticed the post box that is on the wall by the office window – however you can now use this for a variety of things: post a comment, question, suggestion or raise a concern (these can be named or anonymous); drop off forms, dinner money or leave a note for staff. As well as giving you another way of getting in touch, it may just save you a bit of time rather than queueing in the morning or at the end of the day!

Recruitment:

We are currently recruiting for two teachers to fulfil existing roles within the school and we are hoping to bring good news on this front with the next newsletter.

As discussed previously, we have two admin roles coming up in the office so please watch this space if you're interested.

Sun Safety
