## **Outcomes**

2014/15:

35 children made expected or better progress in reading. 15 children made less than expected.

25 children made expected or better progress in writing. 25 children made less than expected.

32 children made expected or better progress in maths. 15 children made less than expected.

All of the children in receipt of Pupil Premium made progress however our expectations are high.

## **End of Key Stage 2 Achievement**

8 children completed the end of Key Stage 2 tests

100% of children achieved two levels progress in Writing; 88% of children achieved two levels of progress in Reading with some making better than two levels of progress and 75% of children achieved two levels of progress in Maths.
