Spelling, Grammar and Punctuation Evening

School Closure

I'm sorry for the inconvenience caused by our recent school closure. The boiler room had no power going to it and despite checking all the fuse boards in the school neither Mr Bate nor myself could establish why there was a fault.

Our school building is tricky to heat and doesn't yet have energy saving measures such as cavity wall insulation to help reduce heat loss. Whilst the weather outside was reasonably mild the temperature inside the building was not appropriate for young children to be in.

The lack of power was eventually tracked back to a faulty sensor which had 'detected' a fire in the boiler room and subsequently shut everything down.

This sensor has now been replaced.

Closing a school is not an easy decision to take and is a decision I take in consultation with the Chair of our Governing Body and a representative from the Local Authority.

Yr 6 Transfer

Parents of our Yr 6 pupils are reminded that the closing date for secondary school applications is Monday 31 October 2016.

The Local Authority have asked school to remind parents that if they do not submit an application their child will not be offered a school place.

The majority of our Yr 6 pupils will be undertaking the Bikeability course in January 2016, but in the meantime we shall be reminding the children about the behaviour we are expecting to see and the parents spoken to if any pupil's behaviour continues to cause concern.
