## Live streaming lessons

We are aware that some parents have had queries about teaching staff delivering live streaming lessons to children at Sutton Primary and particularly the use of Zoom as a platform for this. The Local Authority have informed us that Zoom is not a trustworthy source for live streaming and as a result, we consider that it is not suitable for children and staff to use for this purpose. We are currently adapting out Acceptable Use Policies to reflect the safeguarding elements around the use of live streaming lessons in preparation for September so that children may be able to access these if needed, and in light of the careful and stringent safeguarding measures that need to be in place. We are aware that some other schools may be using live streaming as a method for teaching at this time, but that this should be carefully planned around robust safeguarding measures.
