Sickness Bug

Unfortunately, like a lot of schools in the local area we have sent home a number of children due to sickness and/or diarrhea

As a school we follow the NHS advice that children (and staff) suffering with these symptoms need to be kept off school for a full 48hrs after the last bout of illness.

This type of bug is very contagious and will spread through a school very quickly. Whilst we appreciate that the children (and staff) may be feeling much better after the physical symptoms have gone the bacteria that caused the initial illness can still be transferred to others.

For each event we ask a different set of parents to make or send in cakes that we can sell to the children. For the October Cake Break we are asking parents of KS2 pupils to send in cakes. Each cake will be sold for 30p with all the money raised going to FOSS.

Each child will be allowed to buy one cake with any spare cakes being sold to parents at the end of the school day.

Yr 6 English Competition

On Wednesday 27 September four Yr 6 pupils - Harrison, Benji, Daisy and Poppy - were selected to represent the school in the annual Yr 6 English Challenge.

The children travelled to The Lantern Primary School in Ely where they competed against five other schools in a series of challenging rounds. These included a book round, a memory round and a grammar round.

The children worked well as a team across all the rounds but at the end of the competition we finished outside the top three.

The team were commended on their knowledge of different authors and their behaviour was exemplary throughout.

Volunteering in School

Are you able to offer a small amount of time on a weekly basis to volunteer in school?

If you answered yes to the question you may be interested in our forth coming BRP Training that is being held on Wednesday 18 October 2017. The training starts at 9:00 and will last approximately 90minutes.

This training looks at how children read and how adults can support children to become fluent in this life skill. In return for attending the training we ask that volunteers give a small amount of time on a weekly basis to support an identified pupil who is finding reading tricky to master.
