


Maths Eyes

We use our Maths Eyes to ask and solve questions based on an image. When asking the questions, we try and think of as many different areas of Maths as we can to make sure we are challenging ourselves even more. Here is an example:



Example Questions:

- What fraction of the people are children?
- If adults cost £10 and children cost £5 to enter, how much would the zoo take from the people in the picture?
- Can you estimate the amount of people at the zoo?

Estimation Stations

Possible estimations:

- I estimate that approximately 20,000 people live here.
- I estimate that there are 3,000 windows in total.
