# KSI and KS2 Parents Information Evening regarding the end of Key Stage Tests

In May 2016 our Yr 2 and Yr 6 pupils will be participating in the new end of Key Stage testing arrangements. The new tests, in Reading, Writing and Mathematics, reflect the changes to the National Curriculum that were introduced during the last academic year.

We received confirmation at the end of the school day on Thursday 3 March 2016. In total 6,338 children were involved in this mass participation world record attempt, smashing the previous record of 2,679!

# Sport Relief

On Friday 18 March the children (and hopefully some parents!) will be taking part in the biannual Sport Relief. It is an event we have always supported and have had a lot of en joyment in the past doing so.

This year we would like the children to come dressed in their PE kit as we'll be starting the day with an aerobics session in the hall or some circuits on the top playground. These events will start from 8:45am and the staff will be encouraging the parents and children to join in as soon as the school gates are open.

During the day, the children will have the opportunity to try a new sport or play a sport with a different group of children by signing up to a range of sporting activities prior to the day.

In order to support the Sport Relief charity we are asking for a donation of £1.00 per pupil. The donated money will go towards the Sport Relief charity work in this country and in other countries.

### Easter Assembly at St Andrew's Church – Wednesday 23 April

## Family Worker Update

Verity Puddy is a Locality Family Worker who works with parents from our school. Part of her role is to offer parents/carers an opportunity to come into school for confidential I:I advice/information appointments. These were previously called 'drop in's' but it was felt that this may suggest meetings without confidentiality which is not the case. However, in order to prevent any confusion we have changed the name to: Family Worker Advice Appointments.

These are offered to our school and we will then advertise them to parents/carers for you book yourself an appointment should you wish to meet with Verity.

Family Workers offer advice and information on a range of subjects, such as sleep problems, anxiety and a whole host of other issues you may be faced with. If Verity is unable to give you the advice you need she will do her best to signpost you onto someone who can.

Verity will next be in school on **Tuesday 22 March from 8:40am**. If you would like to speak to Verity on this day please contact the school office to make an appointment in the same way we do for Parent Consultations.

#### Transport Strategy

What transport improvements are needed in your area to help you get around? What is stopping you travelling by foot, bike or bus? How do you want to see your transport choices change in the future?

Cambridgeshire County Council has produced a draft Transport Strategy for East Cambridgeshire, and they would like to hear your views. The strategy encapsulates the way that the council is planning to address the transport related issues in the short, medium and longer term. They want to know if you fundamentally agree with strategies objectives and the way that the policies are being used to improve travel throughout the district.

The Action Plan proposes a range of local to major schemes to improve transport choices and reduce the impacts of transport throughout the district, and they want your views on these proposals.

#### Cambridgeshire Music Concert

This afternoon our KS2 pupils were able to listen to a concert performed by the Academy of Ancient Music. The concert titled Pictures in Music is aimed at introducing children to Baroque Music. The group brought along a harpsichord and other period instruments of that time. They have played a range of music by composers including Handel and Henry VIII.

# Parking at the beginning and end of the school day

Several parents have been to see me to discuss their concerns about the traffic congestion that is happening at the beginning and end of the school day.

All parents are reminded that the small road leading into the community car park and the Brooklands Centre is a private road. Clear access along this road should be maintained at all times.

The Parish Council kindly allow our school community to have use of the community car park on the understanding that the users will not block the access for emergency and farm vehicles. Parents are politely requested not to park along the access road nor to use the area in front of the school gates as a drop off zone. These actions have the potential to cause a serious accident as unfortunately, children do not always look properly before crossing the road and do not always see the danger signs that are present.
