Welcome back to some of our families

It has been an enthusiastic return for some of our families this week, as we welcomed those children from Reception, Year 1 and Year 6 as well as keyworker children into their new 'pod' classrooms. The children all looked extremely happy to be alongside some of their classmates once again and we made the most of wonderful weather by planning as many outdoor learning experiences as possible. Throughout the week, we have been getting used to new routines and ways of working, and I must say, the children have been a credit to everyone adjusting well to the changes we have made in order to keep them safe. Over the course of the week, we have been exploring our new 'Golden Rules' that are below. These have been incorporated into our daily teaching and through Collective Worship, and we have linked this to the theme of 'being thankful'. We welcome your support in helping to reinforcing our 'Golden Rules' with the children.



Safety, Smiles, Standards!

1. **Listen carefully**

There are lots of new rules, to help us all keep safe at school:
2. **Walk, 2m apart and in single file**
3. **Stick to your pod group**

during lessons and at break times. It is not safe for you to leave the area where your pod group is unless instructed to do so safely by an adult.
4. **Be kind and positive**

Have kind eyes, hands, feet and mouths but **do not touch others** or do not touch your own mouth eyes and face with your hands. Although you can't hold hands or give someone a high five, you can still encourage your friends with a smile, a wave or thumbs up.
5. **Look after equipment**

You will have your own pack which you are responsible for. You may not borrow others equipment as we must be careful not to pass on any germs.

6. **Catch it, bin it, kill it!**
7. **Wash your hands thoroughly and regularly**

As our hands touch lots of different surfaces we must follow the instructions of washing our hands as soon as we come in each day, before we go out to play, when we return from playtime, and whenever the teachers ask us to. Singing 'Happy Birthday' twice while hand washing helps make sure we have washed our hands for long enough.

HONESTY
8. **Be honest, tell the truth**

Most importantly tell an adult if you feel unwell, especially if you feel hot or have a cough as we need to keep everyone safe.
9. **Share ideas, NOT equipment, food or drinks**

Things will feel different and it is good to talk, as others may have the same questions, concerns or ideas! Do not touch the same equipment unless you have a family member in school and you are in the same pod.

Now that we have become accustomed to our first week back, please be reminded that parents are not permitted on site at this time (including to bring children into school). I would also like to advise that although it is tempting to arrive early at the school gates, these are not opened until the specific pod timings that have been provided. We are keen not to create gatherings at the school gates, so arriving on time, rather than early will help with this.

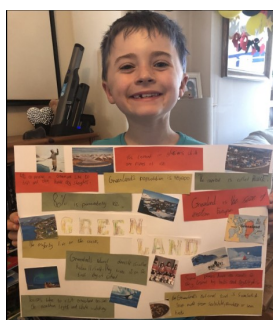
Headteacher roll of honour
