Primary School Admissions Process for September 2018

Parents of pre-school children who will be starting at primary school in September 2018 are advised that the application process for school places opened on Thursday 16 November and will dose on Monday 15 January 2017. This is a national process and the dates are agreed by all the Local Authorities.

Please note that there is no right of automatic transfer from nursery/preschool to a primary school.

All parents are required to apply for a school place - no places are allocated. automatically.
