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30 Days Wild

Sutton Primary School is taking part in this years '30 Days Wild' challenge, where the children are encouraged to take time to think about the world around them and the power of the natural environment in partnership with The Wildlife Trust.

Each day, the children will receive 'Wild Cards' that contain an activity for each day in school. They are all very simple, e.g. Looking at clouds, make a daisy chain, looking at leaf shapes. This fits in so well with learning outside and supports our current learning theme of 'Over and Under'.

Staff will be introducing optional resources such as a wall charts and worksheets, as well as sharing their achievements with me. Each day we will post the activity on school dojo so that the children at home can join in too.

### Online Theatre Show for Primary School aged children



worm!


