# Yr 6 Pupils

Parents of Yr 6 pupils will be invited to two events early in the new term:

At 6:30pm on Tuesday 17 January we will be hosting an end of KS2 SATs Information Evening for parents and pupils. This will be a chance for everyone to find out the facts about the new testing arrangements.

The following week we will be holding Pupil and Parent Consultations for every pupil in Yr 6. These are a new initiative which we hope will ensure that pupils and parents are fully aware of the next steps that need to be taken by the pupils so that they are as prepared as possible for life at secondary school. Each of the Yr 6 teachers will be released during the school day to meet with the pupils and their parents. Pupils in Aquamarine Class will have the chance to meet with Mr Thornley on Monday 23 January or Tuesday 24 January 2017. Whilst pupils in Tanzanite Class will be able to sign up to meet with Mrs Woodruffe on Wednesday 25 January or Friday 27 January 2016.

We hope to run a similar event for the parents of Yr 2 pupils after the half term holiday.

## Primary School Admissions Process for September 2017

Parents of pre-school children who will be starting at primary school in September 2017 are advised that the application process for school places will **close on Sunday 15 January 2017**. This is a national process and the dates are agreed by all the Local Authorities.

This year there is an important change:

- Parents who apply on time will hear on Thursday 18 April 2017, or
- parents who apply late ie Monday 16 January until Monday 1 May 2017 will not hear until Friday 19 May 2017.

Please note that there is no right of automatic transfer from nursery/pre-school to a primary school.

All parents are required to apply for a school place – no places are allocated automatically. If you require help please do contact our school office staff who will endeavour to help.
