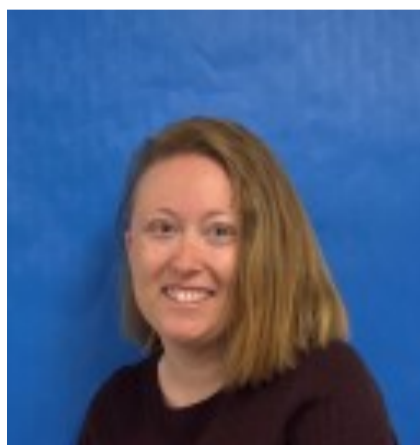

He is now 3 years old, still attends and will eventually need heart surgery, so Eliza is very proud to be swimming on behalf of GOSH.

As of the 27th March, Eliza had already swam 5,900m (5.9km) and hopes to complete the 8km by Easter Sunday!

It has required the development of some tricky skills for some of them, including Miss Turner!



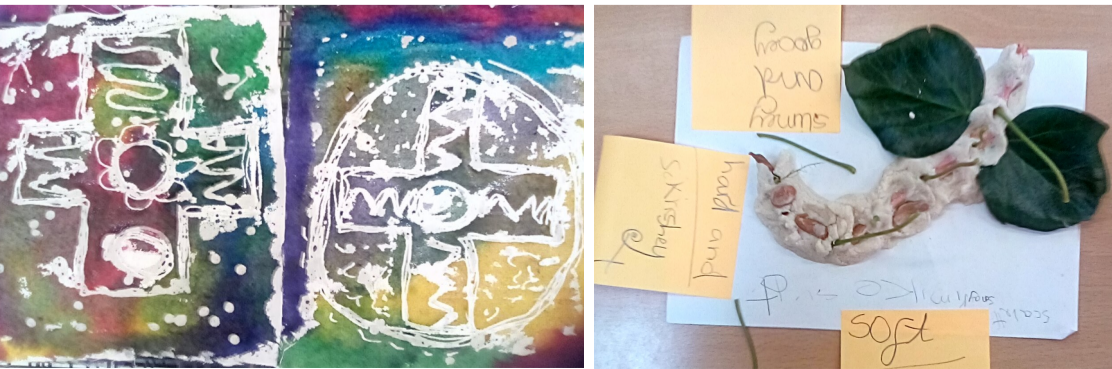
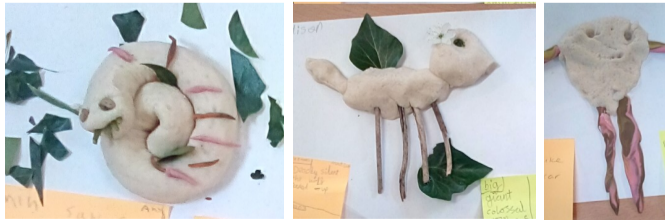
The children have done a great job at persevering and helping one another through the challenge.
