RE & ART PROJECT CELEBRATE RESPECT



The whole school has taken part in an Art and RE project based on respect. Across the school the different phases took different approaches to look at respecting differences and the world around us. In Year 5/6 we wanted to challenge negative attitudes and look at what unites us all. The children looked at how words can be hurtful but also bring us together. The children used graffiti and Lichtenstein style to create thought provoking pieces.

In 3/4 we looked at diversity and how everyone is different but can be together. They made 3D forms depicting all different human bodies and people.

Finally, Year 1/2, EYFS and Paintbox collaborated on a collage made from recyclable materials and different art techniques to show the Creation Story.

All of the children have worked so hard on these works of art and they look amazing around the school.
