SCHOOL UNIFORM 2022-23



We can confirm we will continue to permit pupils to wear their PE kits ONLY on the days they have PE. However, there will be a strict expectation that all pupils adhere to the school uniform policy, including that relating to PE kits.

- School uniform is as follows:
- navy blue jumper or cardigan
- white/navy polo shirt or white formal shirt
- grey/black trousers, shorts, skirt or pinafore dress
- navy blue and white check summer dresses
- black or grey socks for boys
- grey or white tights for girls or white socks
- black school shoes or black trainers


- PE kit black or navy blue shorts and house colour round neck t-shirt (blue, green, red or yellow). These must not have logos or emblems on them. Football kits are not permitted.
- PE kit plain black/navy blue tracksuit/jogging bottoms for outdoor PE

We have taken the decision to continue with these arrangements as it maximises curriculum time dedicated to PE, reduces incidents of items of clothing being lost in school and alleviates the financial burden on parents having to purchase multiple pairs of trainers.

All pupils are to adhere to the school uniform dress code in school. In the event that pupils do not conform to uniform dress code, parents will be notified and request will be made to ensure pupils conform to policy.
