<p><u>Geography</u> Think about the area we live in.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Ask your child to look at where they live. What can they see outside the window in the front of their house? At the back of their house? What could they find near them? Find a map and see if they can find Sutton. Do they know the name of their street? Can they create a street sign with their street name? • Support your child to find out your address.Can they find the number on your door? Can they write the number in digits and words?. Ask them to try writing the number using crayons and paint. Can they write a postcard or letter to a teacher at school?
