School re-opening from 8th March

Following the Prime Minister's announcement on 22nd February that schools will open to all children on 8th March, we are currently looking at ways in which to plan this with the utmost safety in mind. As you will recall, in preparation for our September re-opening, we provided you with a very detailed letter about what to expect and how you could play your part in ensuring that we return in a safe manner.

We do know that this should not be a time for complacency, so once again it is our intention to issue you with detailed information next week about the return for children on 8th March. This will be based upon our risk assessment, the government guidance and upon the information received from our Local Authority partners. We do not expect much to be different to the September re-opening but please do read the forthcoming communication carefully to ensure you fully understand how to work together with us.

We know that many of you will be worried about how you children will cope with the return, how they will manage expectations of a full time curriculum and indeed understand that some children may return who are mentally affected by not having mixed with others for a long period of time. We wish to assure you that within our plans, we have taken account of this and that we will support the children as fully as possible with the return.
